7.	Matters Arising		
	a) 18/04528/OUT – Land North of Alnmouth Station		
	It was noted that no financial support was required by Hillside residents to commission a planning consultant to write an objection statement for the		
	Planning Committee against the planning application. This had been		
	completely funded by GoFundMe. The PC agreed to commission Jenny		

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	Ludman, planning consultant to write the PC's objection statement for the Planning Committee to defend the PC's NDP against the planning application. The cost for this would be circa £600. It was agreed the NDP had been written in good faith and that it was important to uphold the democratic process. The PC therefore needed to put forward representation against the planning application and it was sensible to employ a professional to help with this. Proposed JH, 2nd AH. All agreed. JH to contact Jenny Ludman to instruct her accordingly. Kevin Franklin advised that the Hillside residents would contact NCC to enquire if, on the basis that this application was going to strategic planning committee because it was deemed that there was a strategic need for car parking, NCC would consider compulsory/enforced purchase of land to do so negating the need to build additional houses to raise s106 funds. b) Lesbury Village Hall – Planning/Listed Building Consent Application JH advised that the village hall needs to apply for planning permission/listed building consent to do some repointing work to the building. If an application is made by the PC, then the cost is reduced by 50%. As the PC is the Tenant on the Lease, this was agreed by all. JH to progress. c) Coach Inn Cart Planter: JuH had enquired if the PC might consider paying for the cart at the entrance to the Coach Inn to be planted up. It was agreed that as it was a commercial business, it was up to the Landlord or Tenant to cover this cost and keep the area looking attractive for their customers.	
8.	County Councillors Gordon Castle and Martin Swinbank – NCC Update NCC Local Transport Plan: MS advised the draft LTP was published and included works to take place in our parish as follows: improve the bus stop on Hipsburn Roundabout going out to Warkworth; carriageway repairs to A1068; and improve the footpath on Lesbury Main Street. Steppey Lane Footbridge: MS advised the planning application would be submitted in March with works planned for the next financial year (2024/25). Curly Lane Parking: MS confirmed this complaint was being considered as part of a wider review of parking at Alnmouth Train Station. It's been 3 months since the new parking charges had been implemented on the Network Rail car park. NCC had been monitoring the impact of that. MS to follow-up. North N'land Local Area Committee: MS flagged this meeting was due to be held on 28/3/24 at 6pm at Lindisfarne, Alnwick.	MS
9.	 24/00441/FUL – Proposed demolition of existing bungalow and construction of new 2 storey dwelling - Badachro, Steppey Lane, Lesbury, NE66 3PU – this application was still being reviewed by the Planning Sub-Committee, but the PC would be objecting as, although some adjustments had been made, the key features that were of concern in the previous application remained (23/1506 FUL). The proposal is for a house that is too large for the site, too high, uses material that are not in keeping with the surroundings, which means it does not follow the expectations set out in- the NDP. 24/00449/FUL – Demolition of existing summerhouse and playhouse within garden and construction of garden outbuildings comprising gym, shower/WC, garden room and garden store - Caldy, 5 Croftlands, Lesbury, NE66 3QW - this application was still being reviewed by the Planning Sub-Committee, but the PC would be making an objection as the proposed plan was out of proportion with the site and the building it is replacing.
